While there is proposed delay to ICD-10 implementation, it doesn't mean you should delay training. Coding experts are recommending practices use this time to their advantage and prepare your practice as ICD-10 is a significant change from ICD-9.

ABOUT ICD-10

ICD-10 has a completely different structure from ICD-9. While ICD-9 codes are mostly numeric and have three to five digits, ICD-10 codes will be alphanumeric and contain three to seven characters. ICD-10 is more robust and descriptive and like ICD-9 codes, ICD-10 codes will be updated every year.

The federal government is committed to the implementation of ICD-10. There is no grace period and no transition from ICD-9 to ICD-10. All claims submitted for any date of service starting Oct. 1, 2013, MUST be submitted with valid ICD-10 codes. Claims that do not use ICD-10 diagnosis codes will not be processed by government and private payers causing confusion and revenue delays.

ICD-10-CM ACADEMY OBJECTIVES

This intensive workshop is designed to cover all necessary aspects of ICD-10-CM including overview of code structure, guidelines and conventions including the use and assignment of required seventh character extensions, documentation requirements between ICD-9 versus ICD-10 and more.
